We much figure out how to surrender our hearts to the Lord, and to love God's people in our world. Let us walk in the light of the Lord together that we might shine God's light for all the world to see.

Rhubarb Crunch

TOPPING

1C brown sugar
1/2 C margarine
1⁄4 flour
1/2 tsp cinnamon

Preheat oven to 375 °
