


### Annual Meeting

#### Easy Lasagna in a slow cooker

Easy Weeknight Lasagna in a Slow Cooker Only 3 ingredients and a few hours and this hot Easy Weeknight Lasagna in the Slow Cooker will be your new favorite go-to meal on busy nights!

Ingredients

1-2 pkgs ravioli (depends on size of raviolis)

16 oz jar spaghetti sauce

- 2-3 cups shredded mozzarella cheese Instructions
- 1. Spray a 5-6 qt slow cooker with non-stick cooking spray.
- 2. Spoon a little sauce to cover the bottom lightly. Add layers of ravioli, sauce, and cheese. Repeat layers until slow cooker is about 3/4 of the way full. 3. Turn on low and cook for 3-4 hours.

Notes 1. I freeze the ravioli when I bring it home from the store, so the cooking time listed is for frozen ravioli. You can pick whatever flavor ravioli your family likes (cheese, mushroom, meat, lobster, etc.). And the same for your spaghetti sauce. I make my own sauce, but you can certainly use any store bought sauce that you like (garlic, meat, marinara, etc.
